NOTARY EDUCATION CLASS

OBTAIN THE REQUIRED 3 HOUR EDUCATION CLASS AND PREPARE FOR THE NOTARY EXAM

Topics to be covered:

- The terms of a notary commission.
- Requirements to update and renew a commission.
- Reporting requirement if a notary public is convicted or pleads guilty or no contest to a disqualifying offense.
- Geographic jurisdiction of a notary public.
- Maintaining a notarial journal.
- Requirements for a notary seal.
- What constitutes a notarial act that complies with applicable Ohio law and administrative rules.
- How to perform a compliant notarial act, including examples involving commonly notarized documents.
- Administration of an oath or affirmation.
- Verifying the identity of the principal.
- The taking of an acknowledgment.
- The administration of a jurat.
- The manner of taking depositions.
- Signatures by mark.
- Method to notarize a document signed by a designated alternative signer.
- Overview and examples of prohibited acts.
- Explanation of electronic notarizations.
- What constitutes unauthorized immigration consultant acts and the unauthorized practice of law by a notary.
- The fees a notary public is permitted to charge.
- Mandatory reporting that is required of a notary.
- The conditions under which a commission may be revoked.
- Investigation and disciplinary processes.

PROCESS TO BE COMMISSIONED AS A NEW NOTARY PUBLIC:

1. Visit the Ohio Secretary of State's Notary website at https://ohiosos.gov/notary to apply to become an Ohio Notary. The law requires a formal criminal records check. Effective 04/06/23—peace officers do not need a BCI report.

NOTE: The applicant must upload their OPOTA Certificate in lieu of the BCI report when submitting a notary commission application.

- 2. Take an in-person or online class and test. Visit the Stark County Bar Association's website for information or visit the office to begin the process. (Steps 1 & 2 can be done simultaneously!) Once you have finished the education either in-person or online, you then notify the Secretary of State who will then send your notary commission to you once your application is approved.
- 3. Visit www.Starkctybar.com or visit the Stark County Bar Association for your notary supplies needs.

^{**}An applicant who fails the test, may apply to retake the exam not sooner than 30 days following the date of his or her last exam, and no later than 6 months following the issuance of the criminal records check. Should an applicant fail the exam a second time, the applicant must re-start the process with a new application.
